**James Tyler Fulcher**

**Born November 12, 1866**  
**Dies September 28, 1935.**

Patrick County lost one of its most respected and prominent citizens, the community a good neighbor, and the family a devoted and loving husband and father.

Funeral services were conducted by Reverend E. C. Smith from Providence Church on Monday at 2pm.

The deceased was preceded in death by his parents; George Penn Fulcher; father; and Ruth Ellen Grady Fulcher mother and, one daughter Eva M. Taylor.

The deceased is survived by; his wife Martha Alverta Fulcher of the home; one son Penn of Patrick Springs; four daughters Mrs. John L. East of Patrick Springs; Mrs. John E. Harris, of Stanleytown; Mrs. William Norris of West Virginia.

Marie Harris, M. Fulcher's granddaughter, noted she had taken the above Photograph, just day before the accident.

James Tyler Fulcher is reported to be the first person to be killed by a car in Patrick County. He had been to a building, which he used to store feed and grain for his animals, and was crossing Route 58 at the entrance to Patrick Springs when he saw the car coming toward him. He tried to jump back out of the way; but the driver trying to miss swerved in the same direction that Mr. Fulcher jumped.
